Known for their innovative technical approach, the students present a compilation of short works connected by a common thematic thread – the creation of art imbued with something of the creator's self.



#### TE RONGOMAIWHITI



Four mokopuna descended from four Atua Māori are sent to the sacred school of learning – 'Te Wānanga o ngā Atua.' There they are to learn how to harness their 'mauri' – inner power and one day carry out the important roles of their grandparents as guardians of 'Te Ao' and 'Te Pō.'

However, like all great powers there is also great responsibilities that they must learn along the way to ensure that everything is in unison and as it should be. This is the 'Mana Atua' qualities that they possess as individuals which when combined is more powerful than anything.

Each mokepuna has their own ideas and upbringings on how the world should be but that must all be put aside for the greater good of our realm. If not, then the world as we know and see it will diminish before our very eyes.

What do you get when you cross a tap with a man?

A drip?

A very good plumber?

A stand up comedian?

It's a question that has been haunting comedian Barnie Duncan since he began drawing his Tap Head cartoons back in 2002. Now he's made a show about it. He's also made a giant tap head out of chicken wire, papier mâché and builder's bog, which he wears onstage for half of the show.

Tap Head explores the life of a lonely tap who works in a public toilet, a tap who also frequents open mic nights to test out his jokes.

Spliced together with actual stand-up from non-tap Barnie Juancan, the show is a wonky meditation on plumbing, loneliness, and amateur comedy nights - a show that mixes physical comedy, mime, stand-up and surreal theatre to create a truly unique hour of entertainment.

Compelling, absurd and unsettlingly sexy, The Most Naked will not be the show you were expecting but GODDAMN it'll be the show you're glad you got.




