

over the dashboard. I could have driven to the beach and swum to the pontoon , twice by now ; i picture you + the white speck of iphone on the horizon . come swim away with me


O , plz bring your camera O , to catch me pissing like , a loveheart into the sea ! i never do it though , anymore.
